DISCUSSION:

The program also enables participants to enjoy learning and share cultural and social activities in an interactive and friendly environment.

The OLLI program does not include exams or grades. It is intended to allow participants to delve into subjects that individuals may have been interested in for years, but simply didn't have the time to study. The program is not just the educational component, but also provides the opportunity for mature adults with shared interests to meet and mingle, as well learn from those with different perspectives. The social aspect of the program is a wonderful way for mature adults to build new and rewarding friendships.
