# C. PROCLAMATIONS AND PRESENTATIONS

# C.1 Recognition of Indian Wells Historic Preservation Foundation President Adele Ruxton

Mayor Pro Tem Griffith presented a plaque to Indian Wells Historic Preservation Foundation President Adele Ruxton for her years of service and thanked her on behalf of the City of Indian Wells. Ms. Adele Ruxton thanked the City for the recognition.

#### C.2 Indian Wells Mini Muster Plaque Recognition by Mike Lewis

Mr. Mike Lewis, Palm Desert Historical Society representative, provided background on the establishment of Mini Muster. Mr. Lewis presented plaque to Indian Wells Mayor Griffith and Fire Station 55 Battalion Chief Matthew Kotz.

### C.3 The Living Desert Capital Campaign Project Update by President/CEO Allen Monroe

Mr. Allen Monroe, Living Desert Chief Executive Officer thanked the City for operational support over the years. Mr. Monroe outlined the impacts of the City's support, highlighted global conservation efforts to protect endangered species, new lion ridge project, and special indoor event center to open in Fall of 2025.

City Attorney Todd Leishman provided a reminder that State Law prohibits any campaigning activities within 100 feet of a designated voting location. ## E. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Mr. Clive Weightman and Mr. Michael Douglas, residents, expressed concerns relating to excessive noise at the Hyatt Regency Indian Wells. Mr. Lloyd Shigenaga, Mrs. Sue Shigenaga, and Ms. Carol Kent, residents, submitted written public comments expressing concerns relating to excessive noise at the Hyatt Regency Indian Wells.

### F. CITY MANAGER'S REPORTS

City Manager Christopher Freeland reported Sheriff Department has been addressing the excessive noise violations at the Hyatt and staff has contacted Hyatt to inform them of the code violations. Mr. Freeland read an apology letter from Hyatt Indian Wells General Manager Dan Johnson.

There was discussion on sheriff personnel training on noise decimeters and ordinance. Lieutenant David Wright reported City has ordered equipment to monitor and enforce noise ordinance. Lieutenant Wright encouraged residents call non-emergency number for violations 760-836-3215. Mayor Reed requested

memo be provided by the City Attorney clarifying the decimal noise reading location.

Mr. Freeland reported Planning Commission study session to discuss passive park is scheduled on December 7, 2022. Mr. Freeland reported Indian Wells Golf Resort is hosting Celebrity Golf League being held on April 11-12, 2023 and May 2-3, 2023.

Deputy City Manager Peter Castro shared marketing material relating to the upcoming Indian Wells Winterfest event being held at the Indian Wells Golf Resort from November 22, 2022 through January 1, 2023. Mr. Castro reported resident Welcome Back party is being held on November 15, 2022 at 5:30 and Tree Light Ceremony on November 18, 2023 at the Indian Wells Golf Resort.

**FIND** that under California Public Resources Code section 21080.17, the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") does not apply to the adoption of an ordinance by a city or county implementing the provisions of section 65852.2 of the Government Code, which is California's ADU law and which also regulates JADUs, as defined by section 65852.22. Therefore, the proposed ordinance is statutorily exempt from CEQA in that the proposed ordinance implements the State's ADU law.

# I.5 Adoption of (1) an EIR Addendum and (2) a Resolution of Necessity for the Acquisition of Real Property (APN 633-360-002)

City Attorney Todd Leishman provided an overview of the hearing relating to the EIR Addendum and Resolution of Necessity for Acquisition of Real Property. City Clerk Angelica Avila confirmed the City did receive proof that the required notice was provided. City Manager Christopher Freeland provided an overview of the state mandate relating to affordable housing and gave an overview of the history leading up to the acquisition.

Mayor Reed opened for public comments. City Clerk Angelica Avila stated the City received written objections including objections received today by the property owner which were shared with the Council for consideration, and in addition the City received a written request to be heard from the property owner Attorney. Owner Attorney Mr. Michael Kehoe, Attorney representing owner, spoke on behalf of the property owner in objection to City's intent to acquire the vacant land. Mr. Ty Peabody, resident, and former Council Member submitted written public comment in opposition of the acquisition of the vacant land. Mr. Ivan Moad, resident, spoke in opposition of the acquisition and expressed concerns relating transparency. Mayor Reed closed public comments.

Mayor Reed recessed the meeting and reconvened at 3:30 p.m. City Attorney Guillermo gave an overview of the acquisition and the intent of the project.
